## 8. Fife Council Report

Councillor Calder reported as follows:

- Green space issue. John Rodigan would not come along to the Community Council. Copies of contracts required. Councillor Calder going to search the Archives.
- Bay Travel morning and evening service to Duloch by service 89 replacing the X2. This is being monitored.
- CCTV at Tesco. The camera provision is still 'stuck' in Procurement. Don Jamieson hopes to have cameras in before Christmas.
- Case work – resident asked about getting their road into gritting route and this was successful
- Amazon: getting reports that Amazon lorry situation definitely improved
- Road resurfacing category 2 road. Masterton Road will be done next financial year

Sharon commented that the pavements need done.

Councillor David Ross reported as follows:

- Covenanters Rise – nearly whole of the lights are out. Fife Council will not do anything as not in their remit
- Masterton Road resurfacing: slightly behind where they meant to be
- Recycling points – with brown bins being emptied monthly until March, there is extra capacity to empty recycling point bins more often
- Safer Communities going to put in extra bins

Councillor Ross Paterson reported as follows:

- Social work case – acceptable solution for all parties – getting round officers to do things

#### **9. South Dunfermline Events Committee**

- The over sixties evening will take place on 24<sup>th</sup> March and Clark Stewart has been booked to do the entertainment
- The Gala – decision to be taken on whether there will be one next year – awaiting response from article in newsletter requesting volunteers
- The Christmas tree to be erected beside the pots at Pitreavie School
- Ann and Morag to do teas and coffees at Pitreavie School Nativity Play

#### **10. Any Other Competent Business**

- Consultation on provision of school transport. Councillor Ross did not think it would affect this ward
- Primary 1 Testing – gone to Scrutiny Committee. Majority of councillors – all Labour, all Lib Dems and Conservatives voted to suspend tests
- Evershed Drive Development – no progress – concern over Section 75 money
