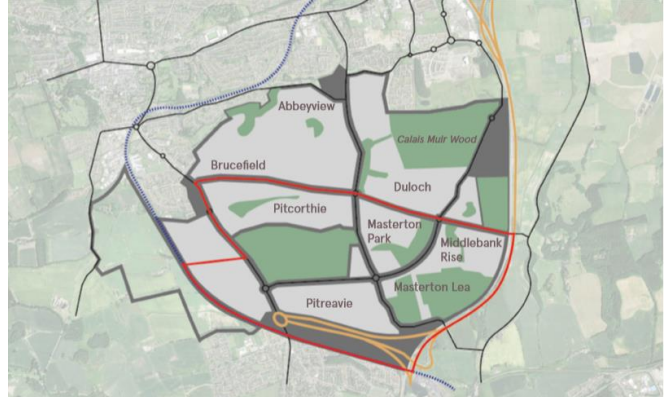


SOUTH DUNFERMLINE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

8. Fife Councillors' Reports

Parks, Streets & Open Spaces, plans are to be taken forward to split the street cleaning and management of green spaces.

Rail line closure at Haymarket over the Christmas period.

Amazon, complaints from Tarmachan Rd residents regarding the number of lorries travelling through residential area when signposted route is via the M90.

Burn through Pitcorthie – no update.

Environmental access team have been in Pitcorthie – positive feedback received.

9. Dunfermline South Gateway

Common Good Fund have been awarded £5,500 towards the Gateway Project.

Locality funding was approved. We have now got approximately £15,500 in our project fund, with a minimum of £25,000 required to complete the project. Alasdair to complete further funding applications in January 2020.

10. Newsletter

December newsletter mostly delivered, thanks to Thana and Dave for taking this on and completing this edition so quickly.

Discussion to be had in January over the size (A4/A5), and the future number of pages, whilst keeping costs similar to those that we currently pay (approx. £700 per issue). Having to order 4000 copies each quarter due to continued house building in the area.

Between the 05/11/2019 and 03/12/2019 a total of 66 calls were recorded by Police Scotland in relation to the Dunfermline South area.

During the same period 7 Crime Files were created for the area for the following offences:

- 1 x Theft from a Motor Vehicle
- 2 x Theft by Shoplifting
- 1 x Threatening or Abusive Behaviour

Schools / Parking Issues

Reminder that Pavement Parking Bill that was recently passed does not come into play until 2021 as part of the Transport (Scotland) Bill. However, it is unclear at this point if Police or Traffic Attendants will have the power.

Queensferry Road

The Enforcement cameras have recently been in the area positioned at the layby in the north bound carriage.

Traffic Police were deployed in the area on the evening of 03/12/2019, positioned at the exit from Pitreavie Golf Course.
