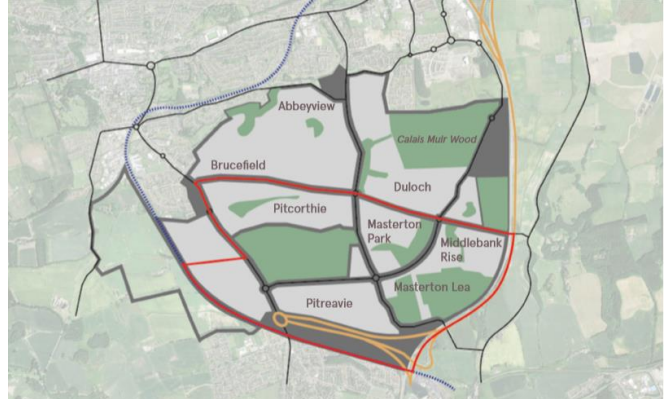


SOUTH DUNFERMLINE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

Between the 01/10/2019 and 05/11/2019, a total of 106 calls were recorded by Police Scotland in relation to the Dunfermline South area.

During the same period 23 Crime Files were created for the area for the following offences:

- 1 x Assault to Injury
- 2 x Attempted Theft from a Motor Vehicle
- 1 x Communications Act
- 2 x Fraud
- 1 x Misuse of Drugs Act
- 1 x Possession of Indecent Images of Children
- 4 x Road Traffic Act
- 9 x Theft by Shoplifting
- 2 x Vandalism

Schools / Parking Issues

Canmore and Pitreavie Primary School's continue to be an issue. We will continue to attend and deploy the speed camera where necessary.

I have received complaints about parents parking on the pavement at Pitreavie Primary School and why Police are not doing anything about this, due to the Pavement Parking Bill that was passed.

The new law does not come into play until 2021 as part of the Transport (Scotland) Bill. However, it is unclear at this point if Police or Traffic Attendants will have the power.

Anti-Social Behaviour

In light of the Pitreavie Primary School vandalism a request was made to have a Domehawk Camera moved into the playground, however this request was rejected due to there already being cameras within the school grounds.

A Domehawk camera would provide no better quality than the one already in place.

No further incidents have been reported.

Christmas Season

As we enter the Christmas period please remember to lock your doors, sheds, garage's vehicles etc. If you are going out for the evening, leave a light on to discourage any persons from targeting your property.
