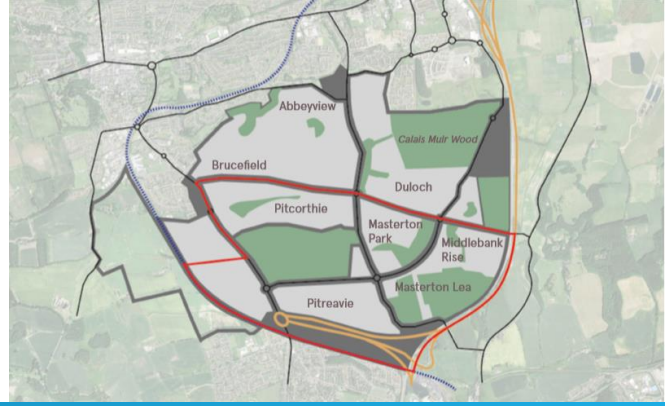


# SOUTH DUNFERMLINE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES
