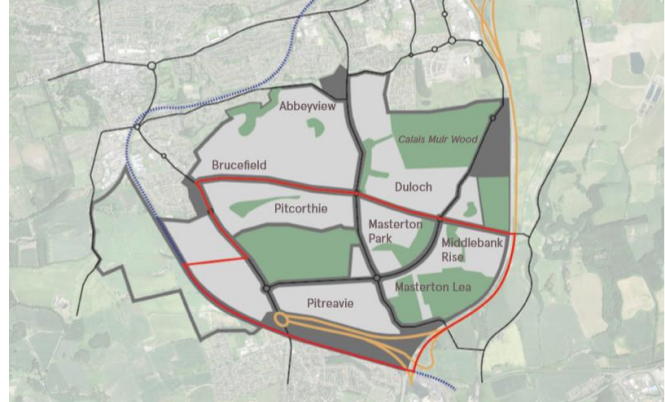


SOUTH DUNFERMLINE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES
