#### Yours Sincerely, or Yours Faithfully -A Message from Rev Monika Redman, St Leonard's Parish Church

I don't know about vou, but I never did really master at school which of these was the appropriate way to conclude a letter - and it probably doesn't matter now, as most of my missives are emails, and end simply 'Mx'!

I seem to recall that the rule of thumb was something like, if you knew the person's name then you could be sincere, but if you didn't, you were simply faithful... The old joke goes that we need to practise appearing sincere... sincerity should shine out without needing practise - but the truth is that the appearance of something is less important than the actual substance, and sometimes we need to take ourselves in hand until our sincerity matches up to our good intentions...and perhaps that is where we are now - weary as we are of restrictions, both longing and fearful of what's ahead, but really wishing it was all over.

I don't know what stage we will be at when you read this. In some ways, it doesn't matter, because the thing we can practise being sincere about is our care for each other. Whether we know each other's name or not, in crowded or poorly ventilated areas, we can be sincere in our care for each other with a few simple actions - whether by choice or by regulation. If we simply choose to care faithfully for the needs of other people, then the details of this regulation, that policy, or even how long we might have to live like this, becomes much easier to deal with.

What I do know, is that by the time you read this, I'll be figuring out how to care sincerely for a completely unknown set of people! By August, I will be settling into a parish just north of Inverness. While I have never known most of your names, it has been my sincere desire to be one of the parish ministers caring for all of the people, here in Dunfermline.

And as a Church of Scotland minister, I've tried to do so 'faithfully' - if you'll excuse the pun! I've loved every part of being a minister here - the services (special like Christmas, and ordinary every week), the schools, the conversations in the cafes, the challenges of zoom, the companionship of other clergy...and of course when you've given me the privilege of helping you at times of sadness or distress like funerals.

Ministry will continue at St Leonard's, as the wider church sorts itself out. You may have noticed some of the covid-related changes that will continue. We now combine a service in the building and on zoom at 10.15 - just get in touch if you'd like to come to either 'venue'. We stream it live on a private Facebook page, and put up an edited recording publicly, too. And the leadership of St Leonard's will be working with other local church leaders to make sure that there is a sincere and faithful presence throughout our part of Dunfermline.

But now it's time to say farewell - that is, may all go well with you - and to do so both sincerely and faithfully!

People affected by visual impairments are more likely to experience loneliness compared to the general population. This can result in poorer health outcomes and mental health issues.

Seescape – the leading visual impairment charity in Fife, urgently requires Volunteer Befrienders to connect with clients, referred for this support.

Seescape works with people living with visual impairments in Fife to enable them to live an independent life. Our community engagement programme, offer people the opportunity to connect with others, whether it's through social groups or chatting regularly with a Volunteer Befriender.

Our telephone befriending service has provided a lifeline for people during the pandemic, with weekly phone calls from a Volunteer Befriender offering clients the opportunity to chat and share interests with someone who suitably matched with them.

Seescape oversee all befriending partnerships to make sure people involved enjoy the experience, with ongoing support provided and regular monitoring.

There are many more people waiting on a Volunteer Befriender and we are looking for suitably motivated, friendly and empathetic people who can provide this much needed service in Fife.

# Local History

#### A Potted History of Pitreavie (Part 3)

Pitreavie Primary School, which opened in 1969, is located within the Pitcorthie housing estate. There are 17 classrooms, a dual purpose hall, an ICT room, music/resources room, multi-purpose mobile classroom and office accommodation. The main entrance foyer is used as a reception and a display area for children's work.

To the south lies Pitreavie Business Park and Industrial Estate, with Carnegie Campus on the opposite side of Queensferry Road. Notable buildings include Caledonia House, prepared by Mercer Blaikie Architects in 1992, and Dunfermline's new £3.6 million Fire Station built by Hadden Group; it covers a mobilising area which includes 46,209 domestic and 2918 non-domestic properties. There is also a small wind farm here, originally developed in association with TechnipFMC.

When Queensferry Road was improved in 1917, Pitreavie Lodge was purchased and demolished at a cost of £750, to widen the road for the new tramway. Pitreavie Cottages (at 'The Entry') were demolished in recent times to make way for the Rosyth halt roundabout. In 1997, the £1.7 million Pitreavie link road was opened to link Pitreavie with the Eastern Expansion at Masterton.

On the east side of Queensferry Road is Pitreavie Playing Fields. The sports pavilion – built at a cost of £12,000 – was erected by the Carnegie Trust and opened on June 13, 1934, by Louise Carnegie. It was camouflaged during the Second World War, after which its clock tower was taken down.

Pitreavie Athletics Centre was first established as a simple cinder track in 1953 and officially opened in 1954 when the Scottish Schoolgirls' Championships were held. It is home to a range of facilities and clubs.

Pitreavie Golf Club opened in 1922, and was designed by the internationally-renowned architect Dr. Alister MacKenzie (1870-1934) – most famous for designing one of the world's finest courses at Augusta National in Georgia, home of the US Masters.

On the southern edges of Pitreavie you'll find the enigma that is the 1-mile long A823(M), one of the UK's shortest motorways. Opened in 1964, it is all that remains of a planned east-west Fife Motorway designated as M92, that would have run from the M876 at Kincardine to Glenrothes - hence the strange unfinished exits at either end of Pitreavie. A short westward extension to provide a bypass for Rosyth was contemplated in the early 1990s, but has yet to materialise.

#### **Pitreavie Primary School ASC Play Area Proposal**

At Pitreavie Primary School our main goal is to encourage and support our pupils to fulfil their potential in all areas of school life. This includes supporting our pupils' health and wellbeing by providing appropriate opportunities for play and movement.

With that in mind, the school (with the support of Pitreavie Primary Parent Council) is currently fundraising for a project to provide a safe, secure, stimulating and inclusive outside play area for the pupils in Pitreavie Primary School's Additional Support Classes (ASC) within the mainstream playground.

As the school is a public footway for people who live on the Pitcorthie estate, the new play area would also provide an enhanced play offering to the residents in the local community outside of school hours.



The creation of the play area would provide a different sort of play experience for the local community which would complement the current trim trails on the school grounds.


We have successfully raised £25,478 from Fife Environment Trust (FFT) towards the total cost of the project and are currently fundraising for the remaining amount.

#### **Police Report**

Back in mid May, I had provided information relating to Parking at Schools and Anti-Social Behaviour.

The school holidays have obviously removed the parking/congestion concerns short term. Primary schools and nurseries will soon have children as young as 3 years old attending for the first time.

It is my understanding that school Headteachers will promote responsible parking through new term information letters and social media feeds to existing/new parents and children.

This safety information will also be echoed at their respective induction meetings.

Each school will continue to work with partners including the police to update their school travel and traffic management plans.

Our Police Community Team will continue to deploy outside schools as part of our PARK SAFE initiative. To engage positively with parents, children and drivers to promote safe driving and offer corrective advice when necessary.

It is expected that some streets surrounding primary schools may become congested for short periods during pick-ups and drop-offs. Our recommendation to residents and parents is to drive within the speed limits and drive appropriately around areas with higher levels of footfall, giving additional consideration to vulnerable (children) road users.

In terms of Anti-Social Behaviour concerns, our police team has been proactive in patrolling your community, engaging with residents and young people.

There hasn't been any significant incidents or issues raised over the past couple of months.


#### **NHS Fife Community Testing**

Several testing sites are available across Fife for members of the public with symptoms.


Anyone with the symptoms of COVID-19 should book a test at www.nhsinform.scot or call 0800 028 2816. If support is needed with the booking process, call 119.

#### Are We All Football Mad?

I'm writing this during the Euro 2020 football tournament. Those who know me, know I hate football, but my husband who's English loves football, so for the last few weeks, he's been keeping me up-to-date with the ups and downs of Euro 2020 football. By the way, I was initially puzzled and questioned why it was called Euro 2020 when it was being played in the middle of 2021. Now I know why.

Even though I'm not a football fan, and the Euro 2020 in particular, seem very similar to life itself: the ups and downs, the planning, preparation and training, the expectations, the pre-match anxiety, the team-work, the individual contributions, the differences between individuals, the hard work and fun, the relief when it's over, the sorrow of loss, the ecstasy of success.

Even Bill Shankly, the Liverpool manager, could see the similarity between football and the whole of human life when he said: "Some people think football is a matter of life and death. I don't like that attitude. I can assure them it is much more serious than that."

During this particular tournament, we seem to have shared many of its trials and tribulations, not just as individuals, but as families, groups, neighbourhoods and nations. Why? I'm not sure. Perhaps it's due to COVID, lockdowns, or the fact that Scotland, Wales and England ALL qualified for the competition, but only England got through to the knock-out stages.

Which brings me to another topical subject – the anxieties of children, pupils and students: who have been unable to attend schools, colleges and universities; share fun and failures with their friends; sit exams; and not be able to attend clubs, camps and end of term proms and parties.

Our children have missed-out on so much and they now need some of that Euro 2020 sharing, caring and comradery to help them overcome their disappointments and anxieties.

One of the great things about children, is that they can quickly make up for lost time. They have voracious appetites – ask anyone with a teenager. And they learn so quickly – ask anyone with a 10-year old who has helped their grandparents with social media or a new phone!

So don't despair, believe in your kids and give them the support and understanding they need, as they overcome their disappointments and catch-up with their learning. Which brings me back to another quote from Bill Shankly that is very relevant, "A lot of football success is in the mind. You must believe you are the best and then make sure that you are."

#### Leek, Red Pepper and Blue Cheese Tart

We have been lucky to have great summer weather the last few weeks and here's an easy to make summer quiche to enjoy!

#### Ingredients:

- 1 large leek (about 300g/12oz) washed and sliced
- Knob of butter
- 2 medium eggs
- 200ml pot of crème fraiche
- 21cm (8½in) pastry case (store bought ready-made)
- 100g (3½oz) blue cheese
- 2 ready-roasted peppers cut into strips

- 1. Set the oven to gas mark 5 or 190°C. Add the leek and butter to a hot frying pan and cook gently for 5 minutes until softened.
- 2. Beat the eggs and crème fraiche together in a jug. Put the leeks into the pastry case on a baking tray and crumble in half the cheese.
- 3. Pour the egg mixture into the tart case. Dot with the rest of the cheese and add strips of pepper. Bake for 35 minutes.






