Spring is on the way and the nights are getting lighter!

We are looking to hold a number of events this year. We have brought back the Over 65's Evening which will be held at Pitbauchlie House Hotel on **Sunday 9th April** (more details on page 11).

The Southern Gateway project is moving along, we were recently awarded £20,000 towards our plans to make the entry to the City of Dunfermline more appealing than what is currently offered.

Following our walk through Pitcorthie last year with Fife Council staff and Councillor James Calder, Parks Streets and Open Spaces at Fife Council have started tidying up the burn that runs through Pitcorthie. This is hopefully the start of a phased tidy up, the community council have allocated £4,000 to the clean up, almost a third of the total budget.

We also understand that the fence between the golf course Path and the golf course that is currently in a poor state of repair around Hazel Grove in Pitcorthie is to be replaced.

Daffodils paid for by the community council were recently planted on the corner of Pitcorthie Drive and Laburnum Road, again we hope that these are providing colour in the next few weeks!

Fife Council have also recently agreed to reduce the speed limit from 40mph to 30mph on Lapwing Drive, which should hopefully make the road quieter and safer. We have asked that speeds are monitored once the change is implemented.

In the second tournament a completely different team with none of the pupils from the first tournament taking part. They won 3 of their games and drew one. Well done to all the pupils involved.

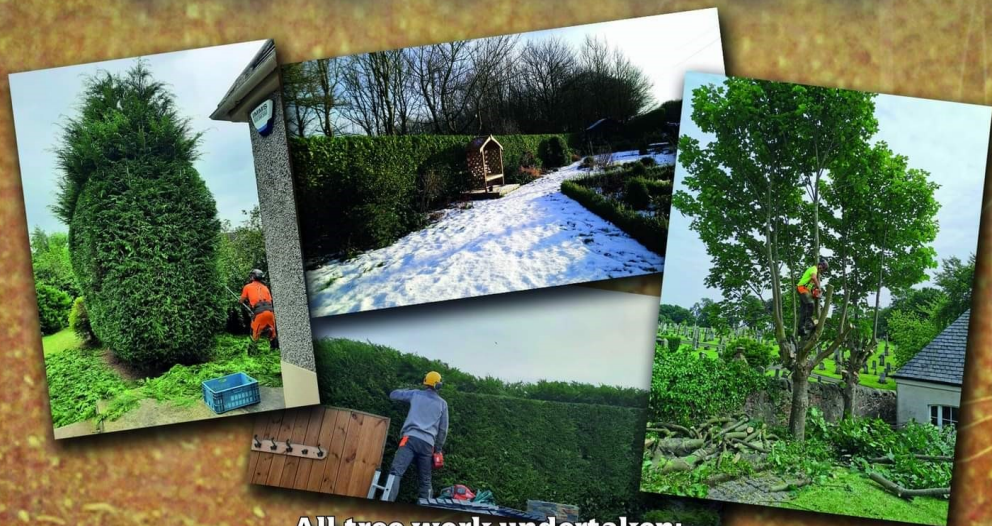
And finally as spring approaches we are looking forward to getting out more and working on our outdoor learning.

Community Police Report

Between 01/01/2023 and 31/01/2023 a total of 377 calls were received to the Dunfermline South Ward area. This breaks down to:

Immediate Calls - 28 calls

Prompt Calls - 156 calls

Standard Calls - 65 calls

This led to 52 crimes being recorded on the Crimefile recording system, 12 of which have been detected as of 1st February 2023.

Free Bulky Uplifts by Fife Council

About 14,200 bulky uplifts take place each year in Fife, with almost 35,000 items collected over 2021/22. This service collects bulky household items - such as couches and mattresses - that are too big to fit into a wheeled bin and cannot be transported to a recycling centre.

Now, residents will benefit from having their unwanted bulky household waste items uplifted free of charge, reducing pressure on Fife's recycling centres and helping residents struggling with the cost of living crisis.

The changes will come into effect from April this year. The service anticipates a three-fold increase in demand with the removal of charges, and additional staff and vehicles will be in place to help cope with this increase.

Cllr Jan Wincott, the Council's spokesperson for the Environment and Climate Change, said: "The removal of bulky uplift charges from April 2023 will relieve pressure on our recycling centres, support residents with financial challenges and help them to dispose of their waste responsibly."

The free of charge bulky uplift service is designed to help people who cannot take their non-recyclable and unwanted items to a recycling centre, either because the item is too large or they have no means of transport.

Bulky uplifts will continue to be ordered online via www.fife.gov.uk/bulkyuplift and the current points system will continue to be used. Uplifts will be scheduled on a first come first served basis and 180 booking slots will be available on a daily basis to manage demand across Fife.

Spring is Around the Corner!



SDCC Update

Pitcorthie Area

Green Spaces

Back in Autumn 2022, members of the Community Council, along with Councillor James Calder met with staff from Parks, Streets and Open Spaces to discuss grounds maintenance issues in Pitcorthie. The main subject was the Whinny Burn which has suffered from years of neglect. There have been issues with vermin and odour which led to a SEPA investigation. Thankfully, funding has been secured from both Fife Council and the Community Council to clean up the burn. Works have now commenced.

The King Malcolm Hotel

It has been established that Peel Hotels no longer own this site. Fife Council have held talks with the new owners and we hope there will be more news soon.

Pavements

After local councillors received a number of complaints regarding the state of the pavements in Pitcorthie, it was welcome news that a phased resurfacing programme has been approved. The first phase is set to be on Pitcorthie Drive, starting at the roundabout at Birrell Drive and going to the north side of Lime Grove.

Newsletter Deliveries

Thank you to Don Makin who has delivered newsletters in Poplar Grove for the last 41 years, and he has decided to take a well earned break.

Masterton Area

Lapwing Drive

At the City of Dunfermline Area Committee meeting on Tuesday 7th February 2023, councillors voted to reduce the speed limit on Lapwing Drive from 40mph to 30mph. This should hopefully reduce the noise impact and more importantly make the road safer.

Children at the west end of the road near Merlin Drive and Fergusson Road need to cross this busy road without the aid of a crossing to catch school buses.

Hopefully this is the beginning of improvements in this area. The Community Council would still like to see a pedestrian crossing installed at the Fergusson Road end, similar to the east end of the road near Aberdour Road.

Older Road Users

The older population in Fife continues to grow with over 20% of the population now being over the age of 60 years.

While drivers over 70 are less likely to be involved in crashes involving speed, loss of control or alcohol as a cause when older drivers are involved in a crash the likelihood of them being seriously or fatally injured is up to four times higher simply because of their frailty.

Recipes

Mushroom Soup

Ingredients:

10 oz mushrooms
2 oz margarine or butter
1 medium onion
1 clove garlic
1 oz plain flour
1/2 pint fresh milk
1/2 pint chicken stock

Method:

Finely chop the onion, melt the butter in a pan. Add the onion and cook gently. Finely chop the mushrooms and add to the pan.

Cook gently for 5 minutes.

Shake flour in milk. Add the stock to the pan, add milky flour. Stir them together.

Liquidise in blender or leave whole.



Leek and Potato Soup

Ingredients:

4 leeks
1 onion
1 medium potato
1 litre chicken stock
150ml cream
50g butter

Method:

Melt 50g of butter in a pan, add the vegetables and stir. Put lid on and cook for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Add the chicken stock, season and bring to a boil.

Cover and simmer for 20 minutes. Puree and then add 150ml of cream.

Reheat and serve.







Pitreavie Primary School ASC Outdoor Play Area

On Monday 3rd October 2022, the ribbon was cut to officially open the Pitreavie Primary School ASC Outdoor Play Area. The new play area has been named 'The Cubby'.

At Pitreavie Primary School the main goal is to encourage and support their pupils to fulfil potential in all areas of school life. This includes supporting our pupils' health and wellbeing by providing appropriate opportunities for play and movement.

With that in mind, the school wanted to provide a safe, secure, stimulating and inclusive outside play area for the pupils in Pitreavie Primary School's Additional Support Classes (ASC) within the mainstream playground.

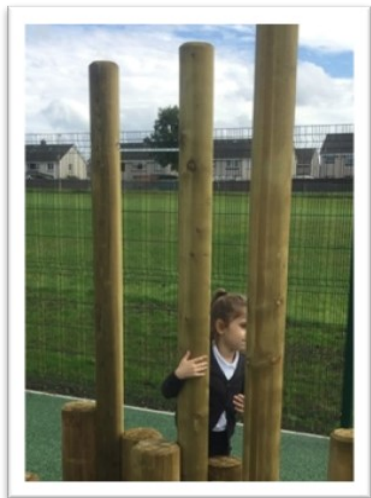
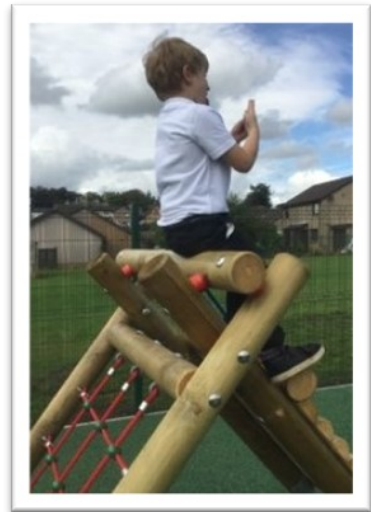
The new play area also provides an enhanced play offering to the residents in the local community outside of school hours.

The development of this new play area started in early 2021 when one of the ASC PSAs, Mrs Rodger, put in an application to Fife Environment Trust who agreed to fund 75% of the project costs which covered the groundworks, fencing and safe play surface for the new play area.

Further grants from the Carnegie Dunfermline Trust, Fife Housing Group and Pitreavie Primary Parent Council covered the costs of the play equipment in the new play area.

The school then worked with Caledonia Play in the summer of 2022 to make the play area a reality. The play area has been a great success and enjoyed by all our ASC pupils.

A huge thank you to everyone who has supported the development of the fantastic outdoor space for additional support classes.

Free Sunday Car Parking in March

The City of Dunfermline Area Committee have allocated £5,700 to fund free Sunday car parking in Dunfermline throughout March.

This means that on Sundays 5, 12, 19 and 26 March 2023 parking will be free in all Fife Council car parks and on-street parking bays within Dunfermline.

Councillor James Calder, Convener of the committee, said, "We recognise that the cost of living crisis is having an adverse effect on people's spending and consequently on city centre businesses. Our intention for this initiative is to offer additional support to these businesses by increasing footfall."

Unfortunately, the Pay & Display meters cannot be changed to reflect this change. There will be temporary signs on the meters reminding drivers that Sunday is free, however Fife Council cannot give refunds for anyone who has still chosen to pay.

At the Main Issues consultation in early 2022, we asked you what your transport challenges were. We wanted your ideas on how to improve transport in the future. Our proposed strategy is based on what you told us.

Fife Council manage and operate the following transport services:

- Walking, cycling and wheeling routes
- Supported bus services, community transport and school transport
- Roads, including bridges, road safety, street lighting and winter maintenance (but not trunk roads)
- Car parks and electric vehicle charging

We also work with our partners to support commercial bus services, rail services, and freight.

Our vision is that by 2033, Fife's transport system supports communities with affordable, seamless, and sustainable access to all aspects of our daily lives.

Our vision looks at four key priorities:

- Fair access to daily activities
- Safe and secure travel for all
- Just transition to net zero
- Transport network resilience

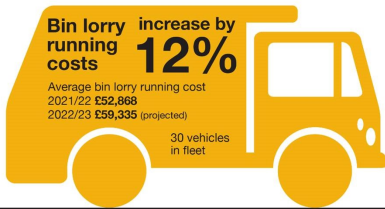

Fife Council Sets Budget and Council Tax for 2023/24

Fife councillors have approved a budget for 2023-24, including a council tax rise of 5% on Band D, to help plug a £11.505 million budget gap and avoid cuts to essential services. The Council will also draw on financial balances to allow one-off investment of an extra £6.448 million in priorities for the year ahead.

Council tax: a 5% increase on Band D is an extra £1.27 per week, taking the annual bill to £1,385.18.

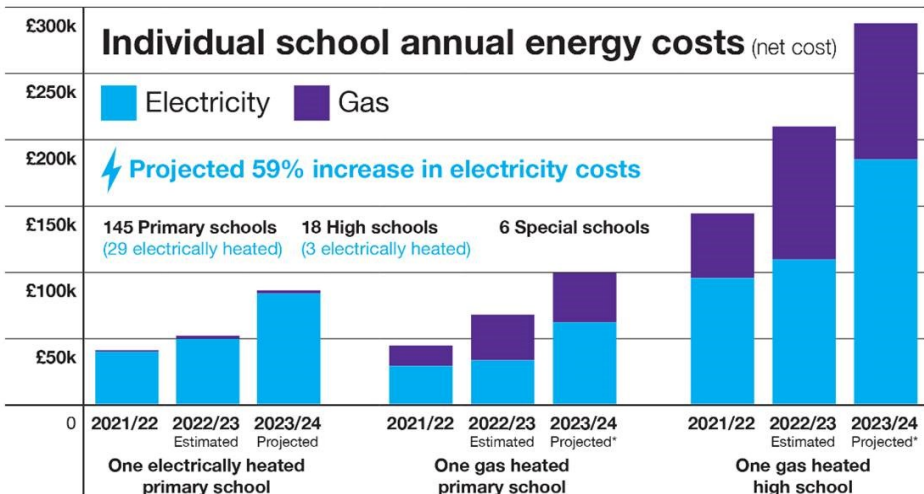

Play Spaces in Dunfermline

Fife Council approved a Play Spaces Strategy in August 2021. The recommendation at committee was for each area committee to categorise Fife Council play spaces in their area.

Each site is categorised as a type of play space (natural play space, local play park, town play park, destination play park), also included is whether the site needs improving.

At present there is no format to play parks that FC manage. Some have 2 pieces of equipment, others like the Glen have a wide range of equipment. Many don't cater for primary school children.

The strategies aims are to:

- be used to secure funding for upgrading play parks
- ensure play parks have a range of equipment that can be used by all ages of children
- transform many greenspaces into play spaces

Public consultation on the categorisation was carried out in 2019. All community councils were notified. Councillors have been involved in checking the categorisation and a report will go to the City of Dunfermline Area Committee in the spring of 2023 for approval.

Portable Equipment Safety Advice

Every year people die and are injured in their homes as a result of fires caused by heating appliances. Many of these fires involve portable heaters. Any type of portable heater can start a fire if it is misused.

- Turn off portable heaters before going to bed
- Always follow the manufacturer's operating and maintenance instructions
- Keep the heater clean and well maintained
- Ventilate the room in which the heater is being used
- Make sure that a permanent safety guard is fitted
- If a heater is to be used in one place for a long time fix it securely to a floor or wall

Whatever type of heater you use, **DO NOT:**

- move a heater while it is alight or switched on
- stand or sit too close, your clothing may ignite
- place a heater too close to furniture, bedding or curtains
- air or dry clothes over a heater
- place heaters where they are likely to be knocked over
- leave a portable heater on if young children or animals are left unattended
- use flammable adhesives, cleaning fluids or aerosol sprays near a heater
